### **Black Maternal Health Momnibus Act of 2021**




Pregnancy-related deaths are 3 to 4 times higher for Black mothers than white mothers in the United States. Hispanic, Native American, & AAPI mothers also experience disproportionate mortality and morbidity rates. These stats are devastatingly old news. Pushing forward, Congresswoman Lauren Underwood, Congresswoman Alma Adams, Senator Cory Booker and members of the Black Maternal Health Caucus have introduced the Black Maternal Health Momnibus Act of 2021.
